



Archie Inns began singing as a Chorister at Durham Cathedral before he moved back to his hometown of Glasgow where he sung as a tenor in a variety of choirs including St Mary's Episcopal Cathedral Choir and the National Youth Choir of Scotland. In Glasgow, Archie was taught by Paul Keohone and attended the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland's Junior Department from where he won a number of solo competitions including, as the youngest ever winner, the 2018 Glasgow Music Festival Agnes Duncan Trophy and was the national winner of the Rotary Young Musician of the Year in 2020. Archie spent his gap year singing at St John's College Cambridge where he started his ongoing tuition with Miranda Wright. Archie is now a second-year undergraduate at Christ Church, Oxford where he is studying for a BA in Philosophy and Theology and holds a Choral Scholarship. Alongside his regular choral commitment, Archie freelances with groups such as Ensemble Pro Victoria and Coro Spezzato and has lately begun fulfilling more solo engagements, most recently as soloist for the Hamstead Chorus' Summer Concert and in a Mozart Requiem in New College Chapel.
